Creating a safe and healthy environment for all is a top priority for schools in our worldwide Jesuit network today. As outlined in the Living Tradition, the most recent official document on Jesuit education, our schools are expected to actively promote and guarantee an environment free from all forms of abuse. This conference is about protecting the minors (and vulnerable adults) in our schools from all abuse, especially (highly harmful and clandestine) sexual abuse.

„What does this have to do with my school?“ you might ask, especially if no cases (past or present) have come to light. But abuse of power, and especially sexual violence, is unfortunately becoming more and more visible in (all kinds of) institutions today. This conference aims to integrate this important but difficult topic into broader reflections on pedagogy and abuse of power.

First and foremost, the conference aims to support the principals of our schools. The ultimate responsibility for protecting all members of the school community rests with them, and it can be complex. After all, what do you do when you receive a serious complaint that someone in your school is crossing boundaries? School leaders immediately face a loyalty issue, even if they „just listen“ to such a complaint, because it is their duty to protect both their students and their staff. The temptation might also be to protect the institution first and foremost. And even before „something“ surfaces, the fundamental question arises: am I possibly a person who is blind to what is happening before my eyes?

Even recognising the importance of the issue, fostering a true „culture of integrity“ is not that simple; it requires real attention and expertise. Prevention is about creating an atmosphere of trust in an institution and using power properly to actually be trustworthy by listening to and protecting the vulnerable.

It is about adults in the school community being aware of the risks of asymmetrical power relationships. This does not mean creating a climate of mistrust! But it does mean empowering staff, students, and parents to speak up when necessary by breaking the taboo and avoiding secrecy.

By actively creating and supporting a robust and accessible grievance system, while taking staff fears and safety very seriously. And finally, more broadly and in the longer term, by further integrating this awareness through positive social learning curricula.

This Safeguarding Conference aims to support European schools by inviting head teachers, along with a dedicated support person, to inform themselves, to share experiences with others and to take fruitful insights back to their everyday school life.

The programme will offer the following:

- expert keynote speakers to help deepen reflection and address questions and uncertainties;
- a variety of workshops to share resources, experiences, pitfalls and best practices;
- essential insights to help school leaders support themselves in this special responsibility;
- valuable general information for beginning or deepening reflection in school communities;
- practical resources to help organise (initial and in-service) training for staff;
- establishment of a European support group for possible exchange of future experiences and initiatives.

Following the conference, there will be helpful publications and a recommended follow-up procedure. However, we would like to emphasise that the goal is not to standardise everything, but rather to support the school's own process. While deepening awareness of (the importance of) this should be a priority for all our schools, it is obvious that our schools have different contexts and experiences; beginning or deepening the process ourselves, in our own authentic way and as part of our overall Ignatian approach, is what is most important.

Ultimately, it is a matter of embracing this development as a school community in the spirit of a true „culture of integrity“ for the good of all.
